4th High Stewart, designated of Dundonald b. 1214. Crusader. In 1253 Regent of Scotland during minority of Alexander III 1263 fought Haco of Norway

He made disposition of his estate to his friend David Drummond of Innetmay. In 1705 sold Rosyth Castle and lands to Archibald Primrose 1st Earl of Rosebery, and the property was eventually acquired by Hopetoun Family, whose present representative is the Marquis of Linlithgow.
