

## WEMYSS FAMILY OF PITTENCRIEFF

### SIR JOHN WEMYSS

of Kincaldrum, Reres,  
and Wemyss

The grandson of Sir David Wemyss  
the Ambassador, now became heir-male  
of the family, and by his large possessions  
and by his reacquisition of early Wemyss lands  
was the real founder of his house. He is first  
named in 1372, when he granted to Sir Andrew  
de Valonlis the half mill of Lochore which had  
belonged to his great-grandfather David Wemyss.  
In 1273-74 his kinsman, Sir David Wemyss of  
Cameron, resigned in his favour the lands of  
Reres, Myrecairnie, Nethr Cameron, and  
Methil.

### SIR DAVID WEMYSS

In 1376 after Sir David's death, his son  
Duncan entered into an agreement with  
Sir John, which, in 1389, resulted in the  
estate finally passing to the latter.

### DUNCAN WEMYSS

Heir of his father in  
1400 Ancestor of Wemyss  
of Reres and Wemyss of  
Pittencrieff, and Wemyss of  
Myrecairnie or Logie.  
Went to England 1432  
Hostage James I probably  
died there.
